

Keynote Speaker



Monica Parry
MEd, MSc, NP-Adult, PhD, CCN(C)
Assistant Professor and Director
Nurse Practitioner Programs
Lawrence S. Bloomberg Faculty of Nursing
University of Toronto

Dr. Parry has worked with individuals with cardiovascular disease in a tertiary care facility for 30 years. She completed a Master of Education (1994) after conducting a randomized controlled trial to investigate the effects of an exercise intervention on self-efficacy and exercise performance in men after coronary artery bypass graft surgery, a MSc (Nursing, 2001) where she described the physiological and psychological responses of men and women waiting for coronary artery bypass graft surgery. During Dr. Parry's doctoral studies (Nursing, 2008) she investigated the effects of a peer support intervention to aid recovery in men and women following coronary artery bypass graft surgery. Since her appointment as an Assistant Professor and Director of the Nurse Practitioner Programs at the Lawrence S. Bloomberg Faculty of Nursing at the University of Toronto in 2009 she has received numerous teaching and research awards and has a solid track record of including trainees and knowledge users in her research and publications. She has supervised and co-supervised 27 students (one international postdoctoral fellow), 12 PhD (including three international), 5 Masters, 7 undergraduate and 2 work-study students. Her graduate students have been successful in obtaining over \$94,000 in scholarship funding and have received \$12,500 in research grant monies to conduct their research. As a PI or co-PI Dr. Parry has received over 3 million dollars in funding and has over \$25,000,000 under review.
